Subject: Reg. GG -- Internet gambling

I am opposed to the proposed Reg GG requiring financial institutions to monitor internet gambling activity for our customers. This monitoring would be invasive at best and put financial institutions in an adversarial role with their customers and their choice of what to do with their money. Costs of monitoring this activity would also be burdensome and would have to be passed on to customers in some form - banks are not non-profit institutions.
