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### Federal role in student access and success

management

Title IV federal financial aid

Enables students to attend college

#### Title IV institutions

- Institutions eligible to enroll students receiving Title IV aid
- Federal govt. is principal; Title IV institutions are agents

#### Title IV eligibility requirements

- Institution-level accreditation
- Office of Postsecondary Education (OPE) administrative requirements
- Performance requirements related to student outcomes
  - Cohort defaultarates
  - Gainful employmentor entity

What is enrollment management?


- Integrates activities of admissions, financial aid, recruiting
- Goal is to "influence the characteristics and size of enrolled students" (Hossler & Bean, 1990, p. xiv)

- Access, academic prestige, and tuition revenue
- Synergies and tensions between enrollment goals

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
# Mean tuition revenue as a percent of total revenue 2003-04 to 2013-14

# Percent of undergraduates receiving Pell grant aid 2004-05 to 2014-15




## Federal financial aid

Disbursement, repayment, and default









FTE enrollment based on 12-month instructional activity Public 2-year includes less-than-2-year institutions

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#### Mean 3-year cohort default rate, 2005-2013 (Year refers to year loan entered repayment)





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
# Number of Title IV institutions 2003-04 to 2015-16

<u>Enroliment</u> management

Policy discourse on for-profits

- Dept. of Ed has been aggressive in regulating for-profits
- Scholars have failed to inform Title IV regulations

Discourse on access inequality at 2014 White House summit

- Scholarship focuses on households and K-12 schools
- Pledges for action by colleges and universities

What we know from research:

- Institutions very purposeful about who they enroll
- Effect of college on students differs by institutional type

Need more research on recruiting

- Which institutions target which prospective students No Board enforcement
- Are some talented students systematically under-recruited?
