**Summary:** At a regularly scheduled joint-meeting of the FRBNY-sponsored Foreign Exchange Committee and Operations Managers Working Group, the members discussed various operational/implementation issues that arise from the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act as apply to the foreign exchange market, such as the Commodity Futures Trading Commission's (CFTC) rules regarding the public reporting of swap transaction data. The members also discussed the Secretary of the Treasury's proposal to exempt both foreign exchange swaps and foreign exchange forwards from the definition of "swap" under the Commodities Exchange Act.
